

Kimihiro Komori, MD, PhD, FACS.

Kimihiro Komori, MD, PhD, FACS, is Professor of Surgery and Chairman for the Division of Vascular Surgery at Nagoya University Graduate School of Medicine and Director of Saiseikai Yahata General Hospital in Kitakyusyu City, Japan. He graduated from Kyushu University School of Medicine in Fukuoka, Japan and did his residency in general surgery at The Second Department of Surgery at Kyushu University Hospital and Fukuoka Central Hospital. Dr. Komori did postgraduate education at the School of Medicine at Kyushu University and then was a research fellow at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester MN, USA in 1987. He served as Clinical Staff of General Surgery at Saiseikai Fukuoka General Hospital until 1990 and later became Assistant then Associate Professor at The Second Department of Surgery at Kyushu University. He is the President of Japanese College of Angiology, the President of Japanese Society for Vascular Surgery and the Past President of the World Federation of Vascular Societies. He is a distinguished Member of many international Vascular Societies, a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and corresponding member of the German Vascular Society. He has published over 200 peer-reviewed publications, including approximately 60 in the Journal of Vascular Surgery and European Journal of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery. Topics range from vascular biology exploration of basic mechanisms of intimal hyperplasia and restenosis to the revolutionary advances in endovascular repair or aortic disease. He has contributed to many international guidelines such as TASC II (Intersociety Consensus for the Management of Peripheral Arterial Diseases) and of the Global Vascular Guidelines on the Management of Chronic Limb Threatening Ischemia. He serves on Editorial Boards of the Journal of Vascular Surgery, Vascular Science and the European Journal of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery.
